Encaustics Painting—April 20, 10 am – 4pm





Erinn Evans is based in Sherwood Park, Alberta. She minored in art at the university of Alberta while earning her Bachelor's Degree in Education. Her artwork often features bold colors and patterns and reflects her love of nature and animals. Painting with encaustics, which is molten beeswax and resin mixed with pigments, allows her to incorporate a variety of materials such as oil pastels, india ink, and decorative papers to create depth and texture. Erinn has taught Encaustics workshops for the Paint Spot in Edmonton, the sociate Signature member of the Federation of Canadian Artists and her work is carried by the Art Gallery of Alberta shop. Bit of History: Edgar Degas



Edgar Degas was born in 1834 in Paris, France. At that time Paris was the art centre of the world and while Edgar was growing up, he was able to see great works of art from the past as well as works being done by artists of that time. He grew up in a wealthy family where his father owned and operated a large bank. His father also loved the arts and would take Edgar to art museums, concerts

and galleries throughout Paris. This is what sparked Edgar's love of art. After Edgar finished high school, his father hoped he would study law, but instead of going to his law classes, Edgarspent most of his time studying and copying paintings at the Louvre. At 22, he finally convinced his father that he would rather be an artist than a lawyer and he went to Italy to study the great Italian artists. When he came back to Paris, he set up a studio and often had many artist friends over to discuss art. They eventually became the group of Impressionist artists including Claude Monet, Alfred Sisley, Camille Pissarro and Pierre Auguste Renoir. He did not have to worry about money so his love of painting did not have the concern of having to sell them in the back of his mind. That is, until his father passed away and it was discovered that he had a lot of debt that Edgar had to pay back. Now he needed to be able to sell his paintings. 
